Option 1

A reading from the Song of Songs

I hear my Beloved. See how he comes leaping on the mountains, bounding over the hills. My Beloved is like a gazelle, like a young stag. See where he stands behind our wall. He looks in at the window, he peers through the lattice. My Beloved lifts up his voice, he says to me, "Come then my love, my lovely one, come. My dove, hiding in the clefts of the rock, in the coverts of the cliff, show me your face, let me hear your voice; for your voice is sweet and your face is beautiful". My Beloved is mine and I am his. Set me like a seal on you heart, like a seal on you arm. For love is strong as Death, jealously relentless as Sheol. The flash of it is a flash of fire, a flame of the Lord himself. Love no flood can quench, no torrents drown.

Option 2

A reading from the book of Genesis

(Gen 1:26-28. 31)

Option 1

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Option 2

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (1 Cor 12:31-13:8)

Be ambitious for the higher gifts. And I am going to show you a way that is better than any of them. If I have all the eloquence of men or of angels, but speak without love, I am simply a gong booming or a cymbal clashing. If I have the gift of prophecy, understanding all the mysteries there are, and knowing everything, and if I have faith in all its fullness, to move mountains, but without love, then I am nothing at all. If I give away all that I possess, piece by piece, and if I even let them take my body to burn it, but am without love, it will do me no good whatever. Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes. Love does not come to an end.

Option 3

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans (Rom 12:1-2, 9-18)

Think of God's mercy, my brothers and sisters, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your loving bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviours of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

Do not let your love be a pretence, but sincerely prefer good to evil. Love each other as much as brothers should, and have a profound respect for each other. Work for the Lord with untiring effort and with great earnestness of spirit. If you have hope, this will make you cheerful. Do not give up if trials come; and keep on praying. If any of the saints are in need you must share with them; and you should make hospitality your special care.

Over all these clothes, to keep them together and complete them, put on love. And may the peace of Christ reign in you hearts, because it is for this that you were called together as parts of one body. Always be thankful.

Let the message of Christ, in all its richness, find a home with you. Teach each other, and advise each other, in all wisdom. With gratitude in your hearts sing psalms and hymns and inspired songs to God and never say or do anything except in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

A reading from St Paul's letter to the Ephesians

(Eph 5:2. 25-32)

Follow Christ by loving as he loved you, giving himself up in our place. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body - and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

(Phil 4:4-9)

There is no need to worry, but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanks giving and that peace of God which is so much greater than we can understand will guard your hearts and your thoughts in Christ Jesus. Finally brothers and sisters, fill your minds with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure, everything that we love and honour and everything that can be thought virtuous and worthy of praise. Keep doing all the things that you learned from me and have been taught by me and have heard or seen that I do. Then the God of peace will be with you. The word of the Lord.

The Gospel text is read by the priest.

Option 1

P **A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew** *(Mt 5:1-12)*

C **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill. There he sat down and was joined by his disciples. He began to speak. This is what he taught them:

'How happy are the poor in spirit: theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Happy the gentle: they shall have the earth for their heritage.

Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted.

Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied.

Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them.

Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God.

Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God.

Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven.'

Option 2

P **A reading from the holy Gospel according to John** *(Jn 2:1-11)*

C **Glory to you, O Lord.**

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him. "They have no wine." Jesus said, "Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

There were six water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water", and they filled them to the brim. "Draw some out now," he told them, "and take it to the steward." They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, "People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink: but you have kept the best wine till now." This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.

Option 3

P A reading from the holy Gospel according to John *(Jn 15:12-16)*

C **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Jesus said to his disciples: "This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love that to lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if you do what I command you. I shall not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business; I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. You did not choose me, no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last; then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name."

Option 4

P A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *(Mt 5:13-16)*

C **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Jesus said to his disciples: "You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men."

"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hilltop cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven."

Option 6

P A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *(Mt 19:3-6)*

C **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Some Pharisees approached Jesus, and to test him they said, "Is it against the Law for a man to divorce his wife on any pretext whatever?" He answered, "Have you not read that the creator from the beginning made them male and female and that he said: This is way a man must leave father and mother, and cling to his wife, and the two become one body? They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide."

P The Gospel of the Lord.

C **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Option 7

P A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew (Mt 7:21. 24-29)

C Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples: "It is not those who say to me, 'Lord, Lord', who will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the person who does the will of my Father in heaven.

Therefore, everyone who listens to these words of mine and acts on them will be like a sensible man who built his house on rock. Rain came down, floods rose, gales blew and hurled themselves against the house, and it did not fall: it was founded on rock. But everyone who listens to these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a stupid man who built his house on sand. Rain came down, floods rose, gales blew and struck that house, and it fell; and what a fall it had"! Jesus had now finished what he wanted to say, and his teaching made a deep impression on the people because he taught them with authority, and not like their own scribes.

Option 8

P A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew (Mt 13:44-45)

C Glory to you, O Lord.

The kingdom of Heaven is like a treasure hidden in a field which someone has found; he hides it again, goes off in his joy, sells everything he owns and buys the field. Again, the kingdom of Heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls; when he finds one of great value he goes and sells everything he owns and buys it.

Option 9

P A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (Lk 6:36-38)

C Glory to you, O Lord.

Be compassionate just as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap, because the standard you use will be the standard used for you.

The Homily

THE RITE OF MARRIAGE

There are three parts to the Rite of Marriage: (1) The Address in which the couple to be married publicly declare that their acceptance of what they undertake; (2) the Declaration of Consent in which the couple give their consent to be married to each other; and (3) the Blessing and Exchange of Rings. The priest conducts this Rite. There are a number of options from which to choose for each of these parts

The Address

Option 1

P Dear children of God, you have come to this church so that the Lord may seal your love in the presence of the priest and of this community. Christ blesses this love. He has already consecrated you in baptism; now, by a special sacrament, he strengthens you to fulfil the duties of your married life.

N and N, you are about to celebrate this sacrament.

Have you come here of your own free will and choice and without compulsion to marry each other?

Both: We have.

P Will you love and honour each other in marriage all the days of your life?

Both: We will

P Are you willing to accept with love the children God may send you and bring them up in accordance with the law of Christ and his church?

Both: We are.

Option 2

P Dear children of God, you have come to this church so that the Lord may seal your love in the presence of the priest and of this community. Christian marriage is a sacred union which enriches natural love. It binds those who enter it to be faithful to each other for ever; it creates between them a bond that endures for life and cannot be broken; it demands that they love and honour each other, that they accept from God the children he may give them, and bring them up in his love.

To help them in their marriage the husband and wife receive the life-long grace of the sacrament.

Is this your understanding of marriage?

Both: It is.

May these rings be a symbol of their faith in each other and

faithful to each other. May they do your will and live in peace with you
and in mutual love. Through Christ our Lord.

Both: **Amen.**

(Some four or five of the following prayer options may be read by guests or friends or family members as desired by the couple.)

P Now that N and N have given themselves to each other in Christian Marriage let us ask God our Father to keep them and all married couples faithful to him, and united in themselves.

R For N and N that the Lord, who has brought them to this happy day, will keep them forever in fidelity and love. Lord hear us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

Option 2

R For their parents of N and N, for their friends and all who have helped them to become husband and wife, Lord hear us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

Option 3

R For the world and its peoples that the Lord may bless them with his peace and the protection of his love. Lord hear us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

Option 4

R For our community and our families, who welcome Christ into their lives; that they may learn to receive him in the poor and suffering people of the world. Lord hear us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

Option 5

R For God's Church, the Bride of Christ, that it may be united in faith and love, Lord hear us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

Option 6

R For all who are victims of injustice, and for those deprived of love and affection, Lord hear us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

Option 7

R For married couples everywhere that their lives will be an example to the world of unity, fidelity and love, Lord hear us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

Option 8

R For those who mourn, while we are rejoicing, that in their suffering and loneliness they may experience the strength of God's support, Lord hear

us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

Option 9

R We remember those departed from us in this life, and especially those whom we, ourselves, have loved: that God will one day unite us again in the joys of our eternal home, Lord hear us:

C **Lord graciously hear us.**

(Note: The priest concludes as follows:)

P God, our Father, you have taught us that love is the fulfilment of the law: may N and N grow in love for each other, and always remain in your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
