CARE OF CREATION

CLIMATE CHANGE; Pope Francis Calls for Conversion and Action 'Laudato Si' calls for urgent action. We must work to end pollution of the rivers and the atmosphere, to protest to political leaders and governments about their feeble actions and their uncaring attitude. Creation is a work in progress and each of us has a vital part to play in raising awareness about the suffering of the poor and the dangers this planet is facing. We must face up to the damage that is being done every day by the use of fossil fuels causing pollution and the poisoning of the rivers and lakes. Time is running out for our planet. Pope Francis has warned of the dire consequences if we fail to act now. He calls for conversion from our 'throwaway culture' and our reliance on fossil fuels.

He states in Laudato Si: 22. These problems are closely linked to a throwaway culture which affects the excluded just as it quickly reduces things to rubbish. To cite one example, most of the paper we produce is thrown away and not recycled.
