Reflection

Jesus says the same in today's gospel: life does not go on here forever. The Master will arrive and things will change. We are pilgrim-travellers on our way to a fuller destiny. Life will go on... but not in the here-and-now. If the pressures of life or mood or obsession get the better of us now, we will at the last leave things undone, things unsaid, things to regret. Life here and now is transient. We have a destiny beyond this phase of life. In response to today's gospel, we might ask ourselves (as Jesus intends): Is this basic perspective – this destiny – sufficiently reflected in our living now? Is it sufficiently apparent in our family life? Do we ever acknowledge death? Is our will written? Or do we live as if we can deny the obvious?
