Reflection

Catholic Schools Week begins this Sunday and is being marked at all the Masses in our parish this weekend. We do so because our schools are places which manifest the life of our parish in action. Catholic schools are successful in our parish and the world over, because they share a clear vision for education rooted in Jesus's understanding of each person (in this case the student or pupil) as a child of God, loved by God and to be cherished by those who form and educate that person. The more deeply that vision is shared by the whole school community – parents and pupils, teachers and support staff - the more Catholic schools succeed. It means that our education is never delivered in a neutral, take-it-or-leave-it way. Catholic Education is at its best when it's delivered in the most caring way possible. The atmosphere of a school makes such a difference. There is no neutral value system that is the default position for "normal" humankind. Similarly, proper education cannot be an ideology-free or value-free zone. The education of children will always have some value-system at its heart. It would be dangerous if it were otherwise. In our parish schools, we put our trust in the person and teachings of Jesus Christ. This year again, Catholic Schools Week gives us an opportunity in our homes, schools and parish to affirm our Catholic Schools as places of faith and learning.

Wherever the Irish language is used it is hoped that those who do not have any knowledge of it will still feel fully a part of the celebration and will continue to pray within the community using whatever language for prayer they feel most comfortable with.
