SUMMARY OF PRESENT REGULATIONS RE: FUNERALS DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

For the most recent guidelines, please check the Stormont Executive website, as follows: <https://www.executiveoffice-ni.gov.uk/news/executive-tightens-restrictions-curb-covid-19>

Social Distancing is to be observed. Face Covering is mandatory for entering and leaving the church. The general public must refrain from attending on the street outside.

- Wakes, Funerals & Burials are Private and now limited to 25 people ONLY from among close family members and close family friends by arrangement with the undertaker. No pre- or post-funeral gatherings at this time.
- Funeral Mass: (i) Face Masks should be worn inside the church; (ii) no physical interaction between sanctuary/altar area and the body of the church (no readers, no other forms of participation); (iii) music by soloists only.
- The Rite of Christian Burial is held at the graveside, with only 25 mourners present. The general public should be absent.

Limited Congregations for Mass: Change in Arrangements

Face coverings (masks) are presently mandatory (especially when entering and exiting)

10am Weekday Morning Masses (including Saturday): St Michael's Church will be open for this coming week for 10am Weekday Morning Masses. You will not need to give notice of your intention to attend. However, the number permitted to enter will remain that which can be safely accommodated.

8am Sunday Morning Mass: Open to parishioners without requirement of notice to attend. Note that number permitted will remain that which can be safely accommodated.

6pm Saturday Vigil Mass, 10.30am, 12 noon & St Mary's 9.30am Sunday Morning Masses: To attend these Masses, please give the parish advance notice of your intention to attend in one of the following ways:

Confessions: 10.30am - 11.30am and 5.00pm - 5.45pm on Saturdays.

Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls:-

From twelve o'clock noon on 1st November until midnight on 2nd November, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father and one Hail Mary) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church, and there reciting One Our Father and the Apostle's Creed. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. Confessions may be made at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st November. Holy Communion may be received on any day from 1st to 8th November. The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st to 8th November. The conditions mentioned above apply also to this.

"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let your perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."

Service of Prayer & Remembrance for the Dead: At 3pm on Sunday 1st November, the Catholic Church in Ireland calls all of us to prayer as we join in remembering our dead. This will be a national communal prayer service of remembrance, lasting for about 15 minutes, and will be celebrated online from the Cathedral, led by Bishop Duffy, and in a church in each parish.
